This species is endemic to the rare delhi sand dunes habitat. This means it's only found in the cities of Colton, Fontana, Rancho Cucamonga, Rialto, and Ontario, California. With your help, we can restore and enhance habitat for this endangered species. *All ages are welcome to attend!*

Directions:

From 60/91 Freeway interchange:

1. Take 60 west
2. Exit Valley Way, turn right
3. Valley Way will turn in to Armstrong Rd.
4. Turn left on Sierra
5. Turn lefts on Jurupa
6. Turn left on Poplar until it ends.
7. Find street parking near chain link gate

From 60/15 freeway interchange:

1. Take 60 east
2. Exit Country Village Road/Cherry Ave, turn left
3. Turn right on Jurupa Avenue
4. Turn right on Poplar Ave. and travel until it ends
5. Find street parking near chain link gate

From 10 freeway:

1. Take Citrus exit and travel south
2. Take left on Poplar Avenue
3. Find street parking near chain link gate
